Please keep this manual in a safe and handy place for future reference.

For the AC adaptor



WARNING

- This AC adaptor is designed for use with only Yamaha electronic instruments. Do not use for any other purpose.
- Indoor use only. Do not use in any wet environments.



CAUTION

• When setting up, make sure that the AC outlet is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn off the power switch of the instrument and disconnect the AC adaptor from the outlet. When the AC adaptor is connected to the AC outlet, keep in mind that electricity is flowing at the minimum level, even if the power switch is turned off. When you are not using the instrument for a long time, make sure to unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.

For the instrument



WARNING

Always follow the basic precautions listed below to avoid the possibility of serious injury or even death from electrical shock, short-circuiting, damages, fire or other hazards. These precautions include, but are not limited to, the following:

Power supply/AC adaptor

- Do not place the power cord near heat sources such as heaters or radiators. Also, do not excessively bend or otherwise damage the cord, or place heavy objects on it.
- Only use the voltage specified as correct for the instrument. The required voltage is printed on the name
 plate of the instrument.
- Use the specified adaptor (page 15) only. Using the wrong adaptor can result in damage to the instrument or overheating.
- · Use only the supplied power cord/plug.
- Check the electric plug periodically and remove any dirt or dust which may have accumulated on it.

Do not open

This instrument contains no user-serviceable parts. Do not open the instrument or attempt to
disassemble or modify the internal components in any way. If it should appear to be malfunctioning,
discontinue use immediately and have it inspected by qualified Yamaha service personnel.

Water warning

- Do not expose the instrument to rain, use it near water or in damp or wet conditions, or place on it any
 containers (such as vases, bottles or glasses) containing liquids which might spill into any openings. If
 any liquid such as water seeps into the instrument, turn off the power immediately and unplug the power
 cord from the AC outlet. Then have the instrument inspected by qualified Yamaha service personnel.
- Never insert or remove an electric plug with wet hands.

Fire warning

• Do not put burning items, such as candles, on the unit. A burning item may fall over and cause a fire.

Battery

- Follow the precautions below. Failure to do so might result in explosion, fire, overheating or battery fluid leakage.
 - Do not tamper with or disassemble batteries.
 - Do not dispose of batteries in fire.
 - Do not attempt to recharge batteries that are not designed to be charged.
 - Keep the batteries separate from metallic objects such as necklaces, hairpins, coins, and keys.
 - Use the specified battery type (page 15) only.
 - Use new batteries, all of which are the same type, same model, and made by the same manufacturer.
 - Always make sure all batteries are inserted in conformity with the +/- polarity markings.
 - When the batteries run out, or if the instrument is not to be used for a long time, remove the batteries from the instrument.
 - When using Ni-MH batteries, follow the instructions that came with the batteries. Use only the specified charger device when charging.
- Keep batteries away from small children who might accidentally swallow them.
- If the batteries do leak, avoid contact with the leaked fluid. If the battery fluid should come in contact with your eyes, mouth, or skin, wash immediately with water and consult a doctor. Battery fluid is corrosive and may possibly cause loss of sight or chemical burns.

If you notice any abnormality

- When one of the following problems occur, immediately turn off the power switch and disconnect the
 electric plug from the outlet. (If you are using batteries, remove all batteries from the instrument.) Then
 have the device inspected by Yamaha service personnel.
 - The power cord or plug becomes frayed or damaged.
 - It emits unusual smells or smoke.
 - Some object has been dropped into the instrument.
 - There is a sudden loss of sound during use of the instrument.
 - If any cracks or breakages exist on the instrument.



Always follow the basic precautions listed below to avoid the possibility of physical injury to you or others, or damage to the instrument or other property. These precautions include, but are not limited to, the following:

Power supply/AC adaptor

- Do not connect the instrument to an electrical outlet using a multiple-connector. Doing so can result in lower sound quality, or possibly cause overheating in the outlet.
- When removing the electric plug from the instrument or an outlet, always hold the plug itself and not the cord. Pulling by the cord can damage it.
- Remove the electric plug from the outlet when the instrument is not to be used for extended periods of time, or during electrical storms.

Location

- Do not place the instrument in an unstable position where it might accidentally fall over.
- Before moving the instrument, remove all connected cables, to prevent damage to the cables or injury to anyone who might trip over them.
- When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. If some trouble
 or malfunction occurs, immediately turn off the power switch and disconnect the plug from the outlet. Even
 when the power switch is turned off, electricity is still flowing to the product at the minimum level. When
 you are not using the product for a long time, make sure to unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.
- Use only the stand specified for the instrument. When attaching it, use the provided screws only. Failure
 to do so could cause damage to the internal components or result in the instrument falling over.

Connections

- Before connecting the instrument to other electronic components, turn off the power for all components.
 Before turning the power on or off for all components, set all volume levels to minimum.
- Be sure to set the volumes of all components at their minimum levels and gradually raise the volume controls while playing the instrument to set the desired listening level.

Handling caution

- Do not insert a finger or hand in any gaps on the instrument.
- Never insert or drop paper, metallic, or other objects into the gaps on the panel or keyboard. This could
 cause physical injury to you or others, damage to the instrument or other property, or operational failure.
- Do not rest your weight on, or place heavy objects on the instrument, and do not use excessive force on the buttons, switches or connectors.
- Do not use the instrument/device or headphones for a long period of time at a high or uncomfortable
 volume level, since this can cause permanent hearing loss. If you experience any hearing loss or ringing
 in the ears, consult a physician.

Yamaha cannot be held responsible for damage caused by improper use or modifications to the instrument, or data that is lost or destroyed.

Always turn the power off when the instrument is not in use.

Even when the [(b)] (Standby/On) switch is in standby status (display is off), electricity is still flowing to the instrument at the minimum level.

When you are not using the instrument for a long time, make sure you unplug the power cord from the wall AC outlet.

Make sure to discard used batteries according to local regulations.

Setting Up



Power Requirements

Although the instrument will run either from an AC adaptor or batteries, Yamaha recommends use of an AC adaptor whenever possible. An AC adaptor is more environmentally friendly than batteries and does not deplete resources.

Using an AC Adaptor

Connect the AC adaptor in the order shown in the illustration.




↑ WARNING

 Use the specified AC adaptor (page 15) only. Using the wrong AC adaptor can result in damage to the instrument or overheating.

⚠ WARNING

- When using the AC adaptor with a removable plug, make sure to keep the plug attached to the AC adaptor. Using the plug alone can cause electric shock or fire.
- If the plug is accidentally removed from the AC adaptor, slide it back in until it clicks into place, taking care to avoid touching any internal metal parts. To avoid electric shock, short circuit or damage, also be careful that there is no dust between the AC adaptor and plug.



The shape of the plug differs depending on your area.

A CAUTION

 When setting up the product, make sure that the AC outlet you are using is easily accessible. If some trouble or malfunction occurs, immediately turn the power off and disconnect the plug from the outlet.



Using Batteries


This instrument requires six "AA" size, Alkaline (LR6)/Manganese (R6) batteries, or rechargeable nickel-metal hydride batteries (rechargeable Ni-MH batteries). The Alkaline batteries or rechargeable Ni-MH batteries are recommended for this instrument, since other types may result in poorer battery performance.

↑ WARNING

- When the batteries run out, or if the instrument is not to be used for a long time, remove the batteries from the instrument.
- 1 Make sure that the power of the instrument is off.
- 2 Open the battery compartment cover located on the instrument's bottom panel.



- 3 Insert the six new batteries, being careful to follow the polarity markings on the inside of the compartment.
- 4 Replace the compartment cover, making sure that it locks firmly in place.



NOTICE

- Connecting or disconnecting the power adaptor with batteries installed may turn the power off, resulting in loss of data being recorded at the time.
- Make sure to set the battery type correctly (page 7).
- When battery power becomes too low for proper operation, the volume may be reduced, the sound may be distorted, and other problems may occur. When this happens, make sure to replace all batteries with new ones or already recharged ones.

NOTE |

- This instrument cannot charge the batteries. Use only the specified charger device when charging.
- Power will be automatically drawn from the AC adaptor if an AC adaptor is connected while batteries are installed in the instrument.

Setting the battery type

Depending on the battery type to be used, you may need to change the battery type setting on this instrument. Alkaline (and manganese) batteries are chosen by default. After installing new batteries and turning the power on, make sure to set the Battery Type appropriately (rechargeable or not) via Function number 022 (page 14).

NOTICE


 Failure to set the battery type may shorten the amount of the battery life. Make sure to set the battery type correctly.

Turning the Power On

Set [MASTER VOLUME] to the MIN position, then press the [\circlearrowleft] (Standby/On) switch to turn on the power.

Adjust the volume as desired while playing the keyboard.

Press and hold the $[\![\boldsymbol{0}\!]\!]$ (Standby/On) switch for about a second to set the instrument to standby mode.



CAUTION

- Even when the [()] (Standby/On) switch is in standby status, electricity is still flowing to the product at the minimum level. Remove the electric plug from the outlet when the instrument is not to be used for extended periods of time, or during electrical storms.
- Do not use the instrument for a long period of time at a high or comfortable volume level, since this can cause permanent hearing loss.


Auto Power Off function

To prevent unnecessary power consumption, this instrument features an Auto Power Off function that automatically turns the power off if the instrument is not used for approximately 30 minutes. To disable the Auto Power Off function, select "Off" in the Function settings (Function 021).

 Adjusts the overall volume.

Starts/stops the Demo.

Starts/stops the metronome.

Holding down this button calls up the Time Signature display (Function number 016 on page 14.)

6 [TEMPO/TAP] button

Calls up the Tempo display. With this status, use the Number buttons to set the tempo of the Song, Style and metronome.






- Press [VOICE] 1.
- 2 Use the Number buttons to select a Voice.
- 3 Play the keyboard.



One Touch Setting

The One Touch Setting feature automatically selects the most suitable Voice when you select a Style or Song (excepting the Song inputted from the [AUX IN] jack). Simply select Voice number "000" to activate this feature.

Playing the keyboard with two persons (Duo mode)



When this mode is on, two different players can play the instrument simultaneously, with the same sound, over the same octave range—one person on the left and the other on the right.

To do so, simultaneously hold down the PART [L] button and press the $[\begin{array}{c}b\end{array}]$ (Standby/On) switch to turn on the power. To exit from the Duo mode, press the $[\begin{array}{c}b\end{array}]$ (Standby/On) switch to turn off the power, and turn the power back on again normally.

Playing a Song

- 1 Press [SONG] 6.
- 2 Use the Number buttons to select a Song.
- 3 Press [▶/■] (Start/Stop) **(** to start playback.
- 4 Press the PART buttons **(0)** to mute the Melody part.



Song Lesson

- Press [SONG] then use the Number buttons to select a Song.
- 2 Press the PART buttons **(1)** to select the Lesson Part.
- 3 Press the desired Lesson button.

[1.LISTEN&LEARN]

..... Simply listen to the Song.

[2.TIMING]

..... Learn to play the notes at the correct timing.



Chord Study

A Song category for experiencing the sounds of chords. Simply play back a Song from this category, then play the notes/chord indications shown in the display.

Playing Rhythm and Accompaniment (Styles)

- Press [STYLE] 18.
- 2 Use the Number buttons to select a Style.



4 Press [SYNC START] **(1)** to turn Synchro Start on.





- 9 As desired, press [INTRO/ENDING/rit.] @ again to apply ritardando.







Recording

Record your performance as a User Song (Song number 113, up to approx. 300 notes), which can then be played back on the instrument.

- 1 Select the desired Voice.
 - Apply sustain (page 9) or effect (page 21) to the sound as desired before starting recording.
- Press [PHRASE REC] 6 to enter the Record mode. To exit from the Record mode, press this button again.




- Play the keys in the Record mode to start the recording.
- 4 Stop the recording by pressing the [▶/■] (Start/Stop) **(5**.
- 5 To listen to the recorded Song and stop the playing, use $[\triangleright/\blacksquare]$.

Playing an External Audio Device with the Built-in Speakers

- 1 Turn off the power for both the external audio device and this instru-
- 2 Connect the audio device to the instrument's [AUX IN] jack ❷.

 Use an audio cable with no resistance having a stereo-mini plug on one side for connecting to this instrument, and a proper plug to match the output jack of the external audio device on the other side.
- 3 Turn on the audio device, and then this instrument.
- 4 Start play back of the connected audio device. The sound of the audio device is output through the speakers of this instrument.
- 5 Stop playback of the audio device.



NOTICE

 When turning off the power, first turn off the power to the instrument, and then to the external device to avoid damage to the devices.

Initialization

This operation initializes the backup parameters and the User Song. While holding down the highest white key, press the [ϕ] (Standby/On) switch to turn the power on.

Making detailed settings



- Press [FUNCTION] repeatedly to call up the desired setting from various items such as Transpose, Tuning, Split Point, Touch Response, and Time Signature of the metronome.
- 2 Use the Number buttons to set the value.
- 3 To exit the Function settings, press one of these buttons: [SONG], [VOICE] or [STYLE].

Troubleshooting
